Faith Promise Update & Challenge: To date, we have received Faith Promise commitments from 28 (out of 132) households so far, bringing the total committed so far to \$39,220. It will require a Faith Promise commitment of \$65,000 to maintain our missionary and ministry support at its current level.

The Missions Committee has challenged us to go beyond that threshold and stretch our commitment this year to \$85,000 to expand our outreach at home and abroad, and we can still reach that goal if all our households will participate. If you have not yet turned in a Faith Promise card, will you ask God to show you how you can be a part of the work of missions both locally and globally this year?
